## SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS (SAP) POLICY

Purpose: Thispolicyestablishes the minimum qualitative and quantitative standards students must meet to maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress in ordenotion receiving federal student aid, California State aid, and Cal Maritime Institutional aid.

Scope:Thispolicyapplies to all undergraduate and graduate udentenrolled full time, part-time, 3/4 time or 1/4 time at The California Maritime Academy (CMA)

Policy: The Director of Financia Aid is responsible for administering this policy and ensuring compliance.

Federal regulations require students maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) to remain eligible to receive financial assistance. The SAP policy governs eligibility for all federal and state financial aid programshe(Note: SAPPolicyfor financialaid is separate different but not any stricter from the CMAAcademicStandingPolicy, which pertains to eligibility to remain enrolled in courses at CMA).

There are two components required to maintain SAP:a qualitative measure, demonstrated by grade point average (GPA) and quantitative measurewhich include both a measurement of pacef progression towards a degree and a maximum timeframe for completion of a program of study.

## **Transfer Credits**

Credit hours transferred from other schools that are accepted toward completion of the Cal Maritime program count as hours attempted and hours completed. These are also factored into the Maximum Time Frame.

A maximum of 70 units of transferable credit from-\$\text{g}\ellar institution will be counted based on CSU and Cal Maritime Policy.

Units from a 4 year institution are not limited to 70; however, transfer credit may be excluded by request if it cannot be used to meet any Cal Maritime Degree requirements (including general electives).
